This session will allow the participant to explore the neurological and sensory-processing mechanisms that influence the development of behavioral self-regulation in children. An awareness of how sensory processing and modulation can influence the dynamics between the person, context, activity/task, and social interaction can provide another lens of interpretation of care-giver and child interaction. Participants will develop an appreciation of how sensory processing patterns of the child and the caregiver can influence the experiences available to the child. The sensory-behavioral issues of children exposed to trauma will also be discussed. The workshop will address competencies required for *ITMHCA Endorsement for Culturally Sensitive, Relationship Focused Practice Promoting Infant Mental Health* at Levels 2 and 3.
